Pilot closed to 1,500ft and 500ft below when a visual was obtained of large twin tailed machine with 6 exhausts presumably a CANT Z 1007. Our A/C pulled up nose and closed the 100yds. N/A then opened fire with orange tracer. Our A/C Pilot opened fire from below with a 3 second burst. Strikes were seen on front of fuselage. Our Observer then advised that he was wounded in the arm. Our Pilot then gave a 4 second burst and observed strikes on fuselage and starboard engine. N/A then immediately caught fire and dived vertically into the sea.</p> <p>Result: 1 CANT Z 1007 destroyed and confirmed. Our observer had bullet wound in arm but was operational again after a few weeks in Hospital.</p>
